

What is the Five for Families Curriculum?

The Five for Families curriculum is designed to help parents, caregivers and family members explore their Five Strengths and promote the health and well-being of their children and themselves.

The curriculum contains more than 60 activities which...

- Help participants reach a more in-depth understand-ing of each of their family Strengths.
- Provide families the opportunity to celebrate and sustain their existing Strengths.
- Enable families to address their challenges by enhancing or making change to their Strengths.

How is Five for Families Structured?


Five for Families is designed with a flexible format to meet the varied needs of families and educators. Created to be fun and engaging as well as informative...

- Activities can be incorporated into existing programming or used as stand-alone offerings.
- Activities can be offered one-on-one with a single caregiver, in small groups, with large groups or as a presentation.
- Educators can choose the combination of activities that best meet the needs of their audience.

Can my organization use Five for Families?

In order for an organization to receive permission to use Five for Families, it must...

- Take a strengths-based approach toward families and services.
- Promote and offer Five for Families universally to all families served, without eligibility criteria for participation.
- Provide the program at no charge.
- Acknowledge the Wisconsin Child Abuse and Neglect Prevention Board as the source of the curriculum in all communications.



Are my employees eligible to provide Five for Families?

In order to offer Five for Families, educators must...

- Have two or more years of professional experience working with families.
- Complete all 12 hours of the Bringing the Protective Factors Framework to Life in Your Work training for professionals.
- Attend a Five for Families Training of Trainers.
- Apply to become a certified Five for Families provider.
- Attend quarterly community of practice meetings.
