This site contains a state profile of how Wisconsin infants, toddlers and their families are faring in three policy domains: good health, strong families and positive early learning experiences. The site includes demographics, key indicators under each domain, the opportunity to compare those key indicators with the national average, and the presence or lack of related state policies. Multiple indicators can be further sorted by factors such as race/ethnicity, urbanicity, and income. There are also sub-reports on Race, Ethnicity and the Health of Babies, Experiences of Babies in Families with Low-Income and Material Hardship.
